Socio-Demographic & Economic Indicators

2010 US Decennial Census Data File

- 10 year survey that provides **population counts** on age, sex, race, family relationship, income and benefits, and education, etc.

American Community Survey

- Annual survey that provides **estimated data** on age, sex, race, family relationship, income and benefits, and education, etc.

Neighborhood Info DC

- Provides **Ward-level** information on range of social, economic, and crime information in the District of Columbia.

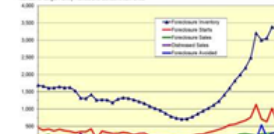

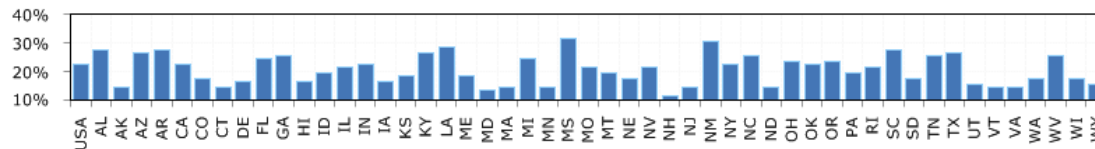

- Provide sub-state estimates (Ward level) of use of alcohol, tobacco, and illegal substance and mental health disorders.

Arrestee Drug Use and Monitoring Survey (ADAM)

- Provide information on drug-use patterns and drug market activity in 10 select cities across the US including the District of Columbia.

Monitoring the Future Survey

- Provides information on youth in the 8th, 10th, and 12th grades across the nation (including the District of Columbia), asking respondents about their drug, alcohol, and tobacco use and related attitudes, beliefs, and behaviors.

Criminal & Juvenile Justice Cont'd

The Administrative Office of the US Court Judicial Business Reports (Federal Offenses)

- Provides information on the number of DC Federal defendants commenced, by offense and the median number of days from filing to case dispositions.

Superior Court of the District of Columbia Statistical Summary Reports (DC Offenses)

- Provides information on criminal cases dispositions and pending caseloads between for DC and US misdemeanors, felonies, and traffic cases.

Pretrial Services Agency for the District of Columbia (PSA) Drug Testing Statistics

- Provides monthly information on the number of adult and juvenile pretrial defendants that tested positive for illegal substance by age and drug type.

Criminal & Juvenile Justice Cont'd

DC Department of Corrections

- Provides information on the number of DC offenders incarcerated in the local Jail as well as the recidivism rates.

Court Supervision and Offenders Services Agency (CSOSA)

- Provides demographic, supervision, charge and behavioral health service information on offenders Supervised by CSOSA.

Criminal & Juvenile Justice Cont'd

Superior Court for the District of Columbia- Family Court Annual Reports

- Provides information on juvenile referrals and include information on juveniles alleged to be delinquent, persons in need of supervision (PINS) and Interstate Compact (ISC) cases

Department of Youth Rehabilitation Services Annual Report

- Provides information on the average daily population of committed youth by age and offense type, re-arrest and reconviction among committed youth by age and placement type, and offense severity.
