I request a written, itemized estimate of any charges, fees, or costs associated with processing or complying with this request. Please include a detailed breakdown of charges, specifying costs for items such as redaction of video, labor, storage devices, and any other related expenses. No work should begin without my prior written approval of the estimate.

Please provide a prompt response to this request. If this request has been sent in error, please forward to the appropriate party. If there will be a significant delay in fulfilling this request due to third-party review, investigative hold, or privacy concerns, kindly notify me of the reason and the estimated timeline for resolution. Thank you for your attention to this matter.

The CJCC, which supports the work of criminal justice agencies in the District of Columbia, has reviewed its files and determined that it does not have any responsive records. To obtain interrogation and/or interview footage from the Metropolitan Police Department (MPD), you may consider resubmitting your request to MPD directly.

If, for any reason, you disagree with this finding you may submit an administrative appeal to the Mayor via the District of Columbia Government Freedom of Information Act Public Access Website (PAL) at <https://myfoia.dc.gov/> by logging in with your username and password. The appeal must include a copy of the original request as well as a copy of the public body's written denial letter issued to you, if any. In addition, the appeal must include a written statement of the arguments, circumstances, or reasons in support of the information sought by your request. The appeal letter must include "Freedom of Information Act Appeal" or "FOIA Appeal" in the subject line of the letter as well as marked on the outside of the envelope. A copy of the appeal must be provided to the public body whose denial you are appealing.
